

Reduce...

- · Air and water pollution by recycling
- Energy usage by recycling
- The amount of packaging by buying products in bulk and concentrate
- The amount of disposable take out containers by bringing your own
- Junk mail by going to www.stopjunkmail.org
- The amount of hazardous materials in your home by using less toxic products

Reuse...

- Durable products like refillable pens, pencils, and razors
- Rechargeable batteries instead of disposable ones
- Reusable cloth handkerchiefs and napkins instead of paper
- Cloth diapers instead of disposable ones
- · Appliances by repairing them
- Refillable mugs and bottles instead of buying water bottles
- A sponge or cloth instead of paper towels
- Reusable shopping bags instead of paper or plastic

Recycle...

- Plastic bags at Lucky or Safeway
- Grass clippings by leaving them on your lawn as a natural fertilizer
- Food scraps and yard waste by composting
- Electronics (working or not): TVs, computers, etc. for free at Goodwill Stores
- Household Hazardous Waste properly by making an appointment (information on back)
- All paper products at the curbside: junk mail, magazines, envelopes, file folders, etc.
- Metal at the curbside: aluminum, tin, and steel cans, foil, empty aerosol cans
- Plastic at the curbside: bottles and food tubs #'s 1, 2, 4, 5 and 7
- Glass at the curbside: bottles and jars
- Motor oil and filters at the curbside for single family home residents
- Household batteries at the curbside for single family home residents, or at the library for apartment and condominium residents
