HIP Housing interviews applicants, conducts background searches, develops a "Living Together Agreement," and provides on-going follow-up support.

HIP Housing is supported by the City of Millbrae, the County of San Mateo, and all 19 other municipalities in the County.

- A Home Provider is matched with a Home Seeker who exchanges household duties for reduced rent

Types of Residences

Most of HIP Housing's Home Providers have a room to rent in their residence (e.g., home, apartment) and some have an Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU).

ADUs, also called granny flats, in-law units, or backyard cottages, are small living units that share a lot with single family home.

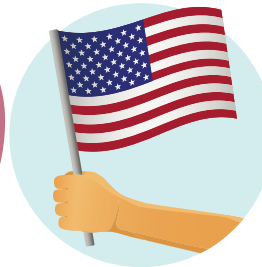

The free HHW Home Pick-up Program allows the County to service the HHW disposal needs of this growing population in an accessible and convenient manner. The County will pick up household hazardous waste directly from the homes of San Mateo County residents who are homebound, disabled, or aged 65 and over who cannot transport products to a County HHW collection event or a drop-off site. Residents must make an appointment in advance by calling (650)399-6919 or (650)372-6200. **Before requesting a free home pick-up, the County highly encourages seniors who cannot transport their waste to request assistance from a family member, friend, or senior support program to make an appointment at an HHW drop-off event and transport waste on their behalf.** Please visit smchealth.org/hhw to make an appointment at an HHW drop-off event.

BALLROOM WORKSHOP & DANCING MADE EASIER

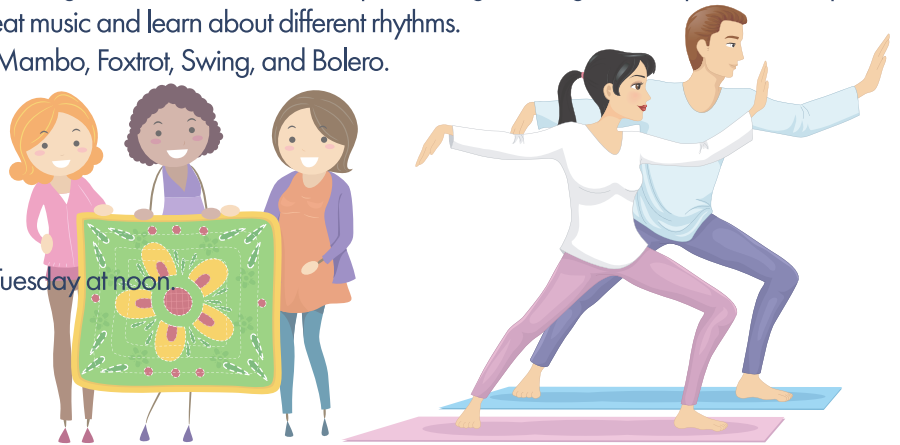
No Partner Necessary, though; if you have one, bring them!

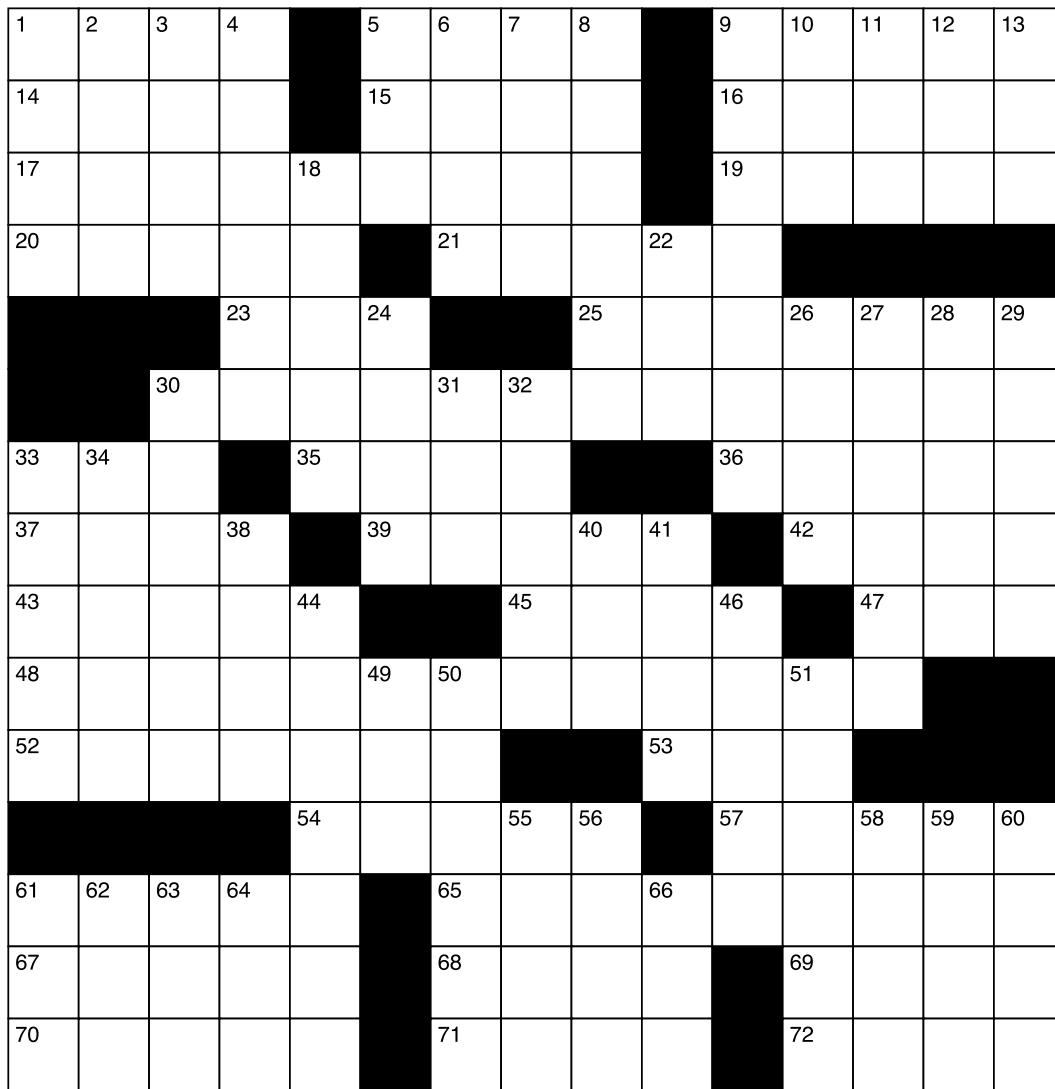

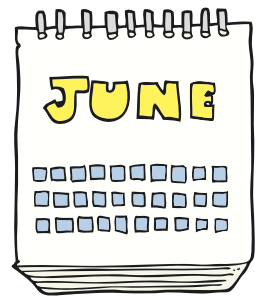
2-1-1 is a comprehensive database of information on health and human service programs throughout the Bay Area, which includes but not limited to:

FINANCIAL SAFETY FOR SENIORS

Financial abuse takes many forms, from stealing money to tricking someone into taking out a mortgage on their home. Here are some common scams and areas of potential abuse. Know what they are and protect yourself!

GOVERNMENT BENEFITS - Beware of people who "guarantee" that they can qualify you for government benefits for a fee. Programs like MediCal, Medicare, Social Security, SSI, and CAPI have set eligibility rules and never charge application fees. Apply for benefits directly from the government agency. Also, beware of scammers who pose as agency workers asking you to verify your Social Security or birthdate for benefits.

POWERS OF ATTORNEY FOR FINANCES - Powers of Attorney for Finances usually grant authority to do things such as access your bank account, transfer property, and place you in a long-term care facility. Get legal advice before signing a Power of Attorney!

CAREGIVERS & IN-HOME HELP - Sometimes, people need in-home assistance to live independently. Before hiring someone, get personal references and check them! Consider going through an agency that uses only licensed and fingerprinted workers.

HOME IMPROVEMENT - Scam artists often go door-to-door, offering to do repairs. They may even show you a fake contractor's license number. Call the License Board to check before hiring anyone. You may be overcharged or get low-quality work. **Better Business Bureau** - (866) 411-2221 / **Contractors State License Board** - (800) 321-2752

PHONY INSPECTIONS - Scam artists sometimes pose as someone else to gain access to a home. For example, a thief may claim to be from the Water Department and ask to come inside and check your pipes. Once inside, they distract you and quickly steal what they can. Never let strangers into your home without independently verifying they are legitimate.

IDENTITY THEFT - Scam artists will use your name, address, and Social Security Number to get credit cards, open bank accounts, etc. Shred all documents you receive with identifying information, such as bills and credit card offers.

PREDATORY LENDING & ANNUITIES - Get independent professional advice before making financial decisions. The salesperson might sound like a good deal, but it could be unaffordable, unnecessary, or a scam.
