COYOTES IN MILLBRAE

Coyotes are not uncommon in the City of Millbrae due to our desired environments of parks and open spaces. Seeing a coyote does not pose an immediate problem as they are a natural part of our environment. Some coyotes lose their fear of humans which then can lead to bolder behaviors by coyotes.

San Mateo County Mosquito and Vector Control do not trap coyotes but will advise residents and property owners about making their properties less attractive to coyotes and other wildlife. They can also direct property owners to the appropriate agency based on their assessment of the situation.

Generally, Coyotes being visible to the public is not a reason to call the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, but if they are damaging property or a resident is in danger, they should call the United States Department of Agriculture Wildlife Services at (916) 979-2675. If there is an imminent threat, call 911.

To help discourage coyotes from visiting your neighborhood and property, you can do the following:

- harvest ripe and fallen fruit
- keep garbage and compost in closed containers
- resolve rodent infestations or other conditions that may bring small mammals to your property – these are attractive food for coyotes
- if you keep rabbits or poultry outdoors, make sure they are in a cage or kennel where coyotes cannot reach them
- do not let small dogs or cats outdoors at night without supervision
- do not feed pets outdoors at night or leave pet food out overnight

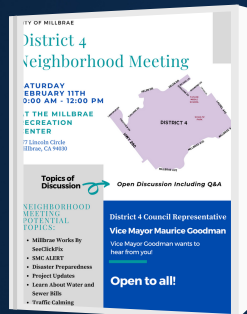
