## **HAPPY INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY**

## Upper Hillcrest Subbasin 4 Pavement Repair Project Complete

The Upper Hillcrest Subbasin 4 Pavement Repair Project has been completed. This project included repairs of pavement, curbs, and gutters, as well as adding ADA curb ramps, concrete driveway aprons, and crosswalks. This work intends to make the streets and sidewalks safer and more accessible for everyone. A resident in the Upper Hillcrest Subbasin area remarked, "We appreciate the City rehabilitating our streets and underground infrastructure. It was needed, and the streets look great."

The work was performed on Palm Avenue between Hillcrest Boulevard and Taylor Boulevard, Hazel Avenue (between Hillcrest Boulevard and Taylor Boulevard), Laurel Avenue (between Hillcrest Boulevard and Taylor Boulevard), Ashton Avenue (between Hillcrest Boulevard and Taylor Boulevard), El Paseo (between Hillcrest Boulevard and Almenar Street), and Almenar Street.



## City is Developing a New Tree Ordinance

The City of Millbrae is currently working to develop a new Tree Protection and Urban Forestry Ordinance. The City's existing tree ordinance, in [Municipal Code Chapter 8.60](#), only applies to street trees within the public right-of-way. The Community Enhancement Advisory Committee members advised and assisted with preparing the draft Tree Protection and Urban Forestry Ordinance as a part of their annual work program.

Residents are responsible for maintaining street trees in front of their properties, but there are currently no provisions to preserve trees or regulate tree maintenance on private properties. The current tree ordinance was last updated on July 27, 1993, under Ordinance 598. Tree permits for tree work conducted in the public right-of-way are currently reviewed

and processed by the Public Works Department. The City issues these tree permits to residents at no cost but requires an encroachment permit (\$358.95) when tree work is conducted within the street.

The Millbrae City Council previously reviewed the [draft ordinance on February 13th](#) and recommended hosting a public workshop on the proposed regulations. The workshop will discuss and get feedback on topics such as the sizes and types of trees that would be protected under the ordinance and to what extent mature trees should be protected on private property. Residents can learn more about the proposed ordinance, ask questions, and give feedback on their thoughts.

On Thursday, March 21, 2024, at 6:30 PM in the Art Room at the City of Millbrae's Recreation Center, 477 Lincoln Circle, 2nd

floor, staff will be hosting a public workshop to discuss and get feedback on the City's proposed Tree Protection Ordinance. Everyone is encouraged to attend. # COYOTES IN MILLBRAE

Coyotes are not uncommon in the City of Millbrae due to our desired environments of parks and open spaces. Seeing a coyote does not pose an immediate problem as they are a natural part of our environment. Some coyotes lose their fear of humans which then can lead to bolder behaviors by coyotes.

The City continues to monitor and work with local public safety to ensure the safety of our community from local wildlife.

Department of Fish and Wildlife advises that people need to haze (scare off) coyotes forcefully and persistently whenever they are seen in their neighborhood. Most people don't realize they can do this or are allowed to but it's absolutely essential for coyotes that have become habituated to people.

The idea behind hazing according to Department of Fish and Wildlife is to re-instill the natural fear that coyotes should have toward people. Department of Fish and Wildlife advises the public to do the following hazing to scare off Coyotes:

- Yelling and screaming, banging pots and pans, blowing air horns,
- Spraying coyotes with hose or water gun,
- Throwing rocks and sticks at them, etc.
- Motion activated sprinklers or noise makers

The point is not to harm them but to make it clear they are not welcome.

**To help discourage coyotes from visiting your neighborhood and property, you can do the following:**

- Harvest ripe and fallen fruit
- Keep garbage and compost in closed containers
- Resolve rodent infestations or other conditions that may bring small mammals to your property – these are attractive food for coyotes
- If you keep rabbits or poultry outdoors, make sure they are in a cage or kennel where coyotes cannot reach them
- Do not let small dogs or cats outdoors at night without supervision
- Do not feed pets outdoors at night or leave pet food out overnight
