Millbrae Programs and Assistance for the Unhoused

The City operates in partnership with LifeMoves for the Millbrae Homeless Engagement Local Program (H.E.L.P.), which facilitates rapid response outreach, engagement, temporary shelter, housing, transportation, medical and mental health, and other supportive services to assist individuals experiencing homelessness in the BART Station and the Downtown areas in Millbrae.

The LifeMoves Outreach Data Report for June 2024 ([view outreach data report](#)) shows that Millbrae continues to be highly impacted by and must be responsive to a high volume of transient homelessness activity at the Millbrae Transit Station. Data collected from January to June 2024 show that 37% of unhoused individuals surveyed arrived in Millbrae through public transit (BART, Caltrain, SamTrans), while only two individuals out of eighty-one surveyed identified Millbrae as their City of residency.

H.E.L.P. utilizes an effective and replicable program model to provide critical real-time response and outreach

services as well as intensive case management to unhoused and unsheltered individuals. This approach to services has proven to be highly effective and successful in the City of Millbrae. Reported data shows a total of one hundred fifty-four (154) unduplicated counts of outreach and engagement, eighty-three (83) unduplicated case management services provided, two hundred twenty-seven (227) temporary housing placements, and five (5) placements into permanent housing.

We are currently utilizing our Millbrae Works request management software for residents and businesses to request outreach and services for unhoused individuals within the City of Millbrae. Traffic Light Maintenance




Drought Tolerant Landscaping Project Complete

The Millbrae Drought Tolerant Landscaping Project replaced 8,000 square feet of existing landscaped areas in front of the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office Millbrae Police Bureau and Fire Station 37 with drought-tolerant landscaping and replaced the spray irrigation system with a drip irrigation system. Drip irrigation systems are beneficial in using 30-50% less water than conventional spray irrigation and prevent overwatering by keeping the water close to the base of the plants and soil. The project was completed with funding from the WaterSMART small-scale water efficiency grant from the Bureau of Reclamation.

The Project used many pollinator-friendly plants to benefit local flora and fauna. Davis Showy Milkweed was planted to support the Monarch Butterfly populations. Many of the plants included in the landscaping are fire-resistant and support pollinators such as hummingbirds, butterflies, bees, and moths.

Drought-tolerant landscaping not only accommodates dry weather but also efficiently manages heavy rain with the use of bioswales. Bioswales are channels that hold stormwater runoff and cleanse water while recharging the groundwater and reducing soil erosion. The bioswales in this project are made out of cobble mulch and will naturally filter the stormwater as it sinks into the ground.

A review of traffic data from 2020, 2021, and 2023 reveals important trends and areas for improvement. In 2023 alone, Millbrae reported 124 collisions, nine of which were major but none fatal. The majority of these collisions did not result in injuries.

In 2023, the Sheriff's Office implemented several key initiatives:

- Saturated Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP): This program focuses on high-traffic areas to reduce collisions.
- School Zone Enforcement: Increased presence around schools during drop-off and pickup times ensures the safety of children.
- Community Safety Programs: Initiatives like the Bike Rodeo promote safe biking practices among children.
- Citations and Warnings: Over 4,500 citations and warnings were issued, targeting problem areas identified through data analysis.
- Collaboration with Millbrae Public Works: Ongoing efforts to address infrastructure issues that impact traffic safety.

To review more data regarding traffic safety, you can look at the [Office of Traffic Safety's \(OTS\) rankings](#). The OTS Rankings were developed so that individual cities could compare their city's traffic safety statistics to those of other cities with similar-sized populations. Cities could use these comparisons to see what areas they may have problems in and which they were doing well in. The results helped both cities and OTS identify emerging or on-going traffic safety problem areas in order to help plan how to combat the problems and help with the possibility of facilitating grants. It should be noted that OTS rankings are only indicators of potential problems; there are many factors that may either understate or overstate a city/county ranking that must be evaluated based on local circumstances.

The Sheriff's Office remains committed to working with the community to improve traffic safety. Residents are encouraged to participate in safety programs and share their concerns with law enforcement.
