

Appointment for District 2 and District 4 Council Seats

Following the certification of the July 23, 2024, Special Election results, the Millbrae City Council is opening applications for District 2 and District 4 Council seats. If you're passionate about making a difference in our community, now's your chance!

Application Period: August 29 - October 1, 2024, by 5:00 p.m.

Positions:

- District 2: Partial Term ending December 8, 2026
- District 4: Partial Term ending December 8, 2026

Eligibility: Must be 18+, a resident of the respective district for at least 30 days before appointment, and file a Statement of Economic Interest.

Completed applications, with supplemental and [FPPC Form 700 Statement of Economic Interests](#) (per Government Code 87200), must be received by the City Clerk's Office by 5:00 p.m. on October 1, 2024. Deliver to: City Clerk's Office, 621 Magnolia Ave, Millbrae, CA 94030. A PDF version of the completed application and Form 700 may be emailed to the City Clerk at etran@ci.millbrae.ca.us by the deadline, with a hard copy mailed or delivered within 24 hours.

Interviews: October 7, 2024, at a Special City Council meeting.

FAQ: Next Steps After the Certification of Councilmembers Recalled Continued

1. The San Mateo County Elections Office certified the Special Election for District 2 and District 4; both Councilmembers were recalled as of August 22, 2024. What options does the City Council now have?

Under Government Code §36512(b), the City Council has 60 days commencing from August 22, 2024, to consider the following two options to fill the Council District 2 and District 4 vacancies:

a. Appointment: The remaining City Councilmembers may choose to appoint a new member from each district who meets the eligibility requirements to run for elected office;

or

b. Special Election: Call for a special election to be held on March 4, 2025.

2. Can the City Council make appointments in the interim and call for a special election for March 2025?

The law does not allow for interim councilmember appointments prior to the March 2025 election. (Government Code §36512(b))

3. Is the Council appointing or calling for a special election?

At the August 27 City Council meeting, the Council directed staff to start accepting applications to fill the District 2 and District 4 vacancies while keeping the option of calling a special election open. Watch the meeting discussion with this link: <https://bit.ly/MCC20240827>

4. What is the timeline for appointment to the City Council?

- October 1, 2024 by 5:00 p.m. – Application, supplement questions, and Form 700 due to the City Clerk.
- October 7, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. – Interview of applicants at a Special City Council meeting.
- October 22, 2024 – Decision to be made: Appointment/Call for Special Election.

5. What is the eligibility to apply for an appointment to City Council?

Applicants must be at least 18 years old, a qualified elector, and a resident of the respective district (District 2 or District 4) for at least 30 days before the appointment.

6. What is the term of the appointment?

From appointment date to December 8, 2026.

7. How do I apply?

Completed [applications](#), with supplemental and [FPPC Form 700 Statement of Economic Interests](#) (per Government Code 87200), must be received by the City Clerk's Office by 5:00 p.m. on October 1, 2024. Deliver to: City Clerk's Office, 621 Magnolia Ave, Millbrae, CA 94030. A PDF version of the completed application and form 700 may be emailed to the City Clerk at etran@ci.millbrae.ca.us by the deadline with a hard copy mailed or delivered within 24 hours. The email date will suffice to establish meeting the deadline.

Millbrae Parks and Recreation: Exciting Updates to Enhance Community Spaces

The City of Millbrae is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life for residents through the maintenance and development of community spaces. This year, several exciting projects have been completed or are underway that will provide updated and improved facilities for residents of all ages to enjoy. Key among these are the renovations at the Taylor Basketball Courts, the rehabilitation of Greenhill's Pathway, and the revitalization of Marina Vista Park and Playground.

The Taylor Middle School basketball courts are finalized and were an exciting surprise to many of the students returning to school. The courts were resurfaced and then painted to host six full courts!

The Green Hills Park Trail Rehabilitation Project was completed and repaired the deteriorated asphalt concrete pathway throughout Green Hills Park. The rehabilitation made great improvements to the trail, making it more enjoyable, safe, and accessible for all to use.

The Marina Vista Park Renovation project is underway and in progress. The park site has been cleared and grubbed (tree and brush removed). The contractor is installing the underground irrigation pipe and electrical lines for the sprinkler system.

Last month, the City Hall parking lot was resurfaced with a slurry seal and restriped. The City's Parks Division added new landscaping, while the Street Division completed the striping.

City of Millbrae Prioritizes Affordable Housing Approving Plans for 97 New Units of Affordable Housing

The City of Millbrae continues to prioritize affordable housing within the community. On Monday evening, August 19, 2024, the Planning Commission approved the 1301 Broadway project, a significant new development that will bring ninety-seven (97) affordable housing units to the community.

The 1301 Broadway project will feature a mix of housing options, including ten (10) units for very low-income residents, sixty-six (66) units for low-income residents, nineteen (19) units for moderate-income residents, and two (2) on-site manager units.

The unit mix includes thirty (30) studios, ten (10) one-bedroom units, thirty (30) two-bedroom units, and twenty-seven (27) three-bedroom units, ranging in size from 411 to 1,018 square feet.

The six-story building, standing ninety-three (93) feet tall with one sub-level of parking, will include sixty-three (63) off-street interior parking spaces and 2,412 square feet of interior courtyard space.



In addition to providing essential housing, the project will also contribute to the community by enhancing local infrastructure. Planned improvements include an enhanced crosswalk with bulb-outs across Ludeman Lane, the addition of street trees and landscaping, and the contribution of development impact fees.

The 1301 Broadway project represents another milestone in addressing the City's affordable housing needs while enhancing the local community's infrastructure and aesthetic appeal.




Parents' Night Out


