

Millbrae 2024 Water Quality Report Summary

Learn About Your Water System Did you know your water comes from San Francisco? That's right, Millbrae and 24 other cities and water districts buy water from SFPUC, sourced from reservoirs in the Sierra Nevadas, Alameda County, San Mateo County, and Hetch Hetchy. No wonder it tastes so good! Five main entry points feed Millbrae's system, all monitored through our SCADA system, which provides real-time water quality data so our water division can respond quickly to any issues.

Key Findings 2024 testing showed we consistently met or exceeded all regulatory standards.

Turbidity Levels Turbidity measures suspended particles in water. Think about when you're wading at the beach, you shuffle your feet against the sand, and the water suddenly turns from its usual murky green to brown, the sand is now suspended in the water rather than being settled on the ocean floor, that's turbidity. Thanks to our water system, all filtered waters were clear with turbidity levels well below regulatory limits, showing we're doing a great job filtering your water!

Disinfection Byproducts Sometimes, when chemicals mix, they produce another chemical that was not meant to occur, this is called a byproduct. When our water was tested for trihalomethanes, a group of chemicals that can form in drinking water when chlorine (common disinfectant) reacts with organic matter, we averaged 49 parts per billion(ppb), the max allowable level is 80 ppb. Our water was also tested for Haloacetic acids (HAAs) another byproduct of chlorine and organic matter, averaged 42ppb where the max allowable level is 60ppb.

Fluoride Making your dentist appointments cheaper! We maintain fluoride at the optimal 0.7 ppm to prevent tooth decay and minimize dental fluorosis risk.

Lead and Copper Our 2022 testing shows lead levels at 4.9 ppb which is better than 90% of water systems. While no city water lines contain lead, your home may have lead pipes. To be safe, consider using filters or letting the faucet run before use. Read more about large scale pipe flushing on page 3.

PFAS There's been concern over PFAS "forever chemicals" used in non-stick pans, stain-resistant fabrics, and food packaging. Fortunately, our 2023 voluntary monitoring found no detection above reporting levels!

Boron We detected 2.3 ppm boron in untreated Alameda Watershed water, which exceeded California's 1 ppm limit. However, the water was diluted below 1 ppm before treatment, so what reached your home had safe boron levels.

Why hydrant flushing is important for our water system

Ever chewed out one of our water guys because you saw them opening a fire hydrant and letting perfectly good water flow into the gutter? This article might make you think twice.

Flushing water mains can seem contradictory to the City's commitment to water conservation. However, the health of our water system and our residents is more important, and here's why.

Flushing water mains is crucial for keeping our water quality clean, it removes sediment, mineral deposits, and other buildup that can accumulate in pipes. When you see a hydrant being released for flushing, the pressurized water flows at high speed, making it look like our water guys are wasting a lot of water. Think about it like our water division is pressure washing the pipes. Not only does this remove impurities, but it also improves water pressure by clearing any blockages and damaging air pockets.

Progress update on the 2025 Street Resurfacing Project in the Upper Meadows neighborhood:

Dig Outs are areas where damaged pavement is being removed and repaired to ensure a strong base before final resurfacing. Please note that these are not the final driving surface, but important preparation work ahead of the upcoming slurry seal.

Existing street markings are being removed as part of the preparation process. New striping will be applied once the final slurry seal is in place.

Please Note: The dig outs may appear rough or unfinished, but they are a key step in the process. The final slurry seal is scheduled to be applied in the coming weeks, which will create a smooth, uniform surface throughout the area.

We thank you for your patience and cooperation as we work to improve the condition of your streets. Please continue to observe No Parking signs and temporary traffic controls to help keep the project on schedule and ensure everyone's safety.

Leash Law

If you're a pet owner in Millbrae, here's what you need to know about keeping your furry friends safe while out and about.

According to Millbrae Municipal Code 6.04, dogs must be on a leash when on public streets, sidewalks, parks, school grounds, or any public property. The leash must be properly connected to your pet's collar, harness, or halter.

Cat owners, don't worry, we won't make you force fluffy into a harness, the leash requirement doesn't apply to our feline friends, who can continue their neighborhood supervision duties unleashed.

There's also an important exception for service animals. If your dog is a professional, they are exempt from the leash requirement when they're under the complete control of their owner or caretaker.

With school starting up, we'd like remind you to please keep dogs off sports fields to ensure safe, clean spaces for student activities.

The bottom line is simple, when you're out in public with your dog, make sure they're leashed. It keeps everyone safe, shows you're a responsible pet owner, and helps avoid any potential fines. Thanks for following the law Millbrae!



Traffic Calming Program

Our Traffic Calming Program helps make neighborhoods safer and more walkable by slowing down drivers on residential streets. On a case-by-case basis our engineers will install speed bumps, raised crosswalks, speed cushions, curb extensions/bulb-outs and better road markings to make streets safer for everyone.

Last year, we made improvements to Park Boulevard with new road striping, plastic posts, and a flashing light. City Engineers have monitored the effectiveness of the project and are assessing the impacts of additional speed cushions or speed tablets, specifically on emergency services.



Our Engineering Division is committed to bettering street safety for all. If you have a specific concern regarding traffic calming fill out a [traffic calming request form](#). Make sure to include photos and any other information that would be helpful to our Engineers.


